# The General Development Pathway (GDA). What is it, and how do you get referred?

In Doncaster the GDA Pathway (also known as **needs-led neurodevelopmental assessment**) is a route by which children are assessed for autism, ADHD, development delays, dyspraxia and cerebral palsy. Your child can be referred to the GDA Pathway by your local SEN provision at your child's school, the School Nursing Team, or your GP (if your child is under 2).



A referral will consist of the following evidence:

- X 2 terms of evidence of progress which could be through a SEN Plan, Individual Support Plan or Behaviour Support Plan, submitted from the early years provider, school or post 16 setting.
- Completed GDA Health Summary by the School Nurse or Health Visitor.
- Completed referral form by the SENCO, School Nurse/Health Visitor or Early Years
- Completed setting and parent questionnaires.

After a completed referral is submitted, your child will be invited for a clinic appointment with a doctor who will perform an initial assessment. After this initial assessment appointment your child may:

- Have a further follow up appointment for further assessment or monitoring. They
  may also ask for more information from your school or early years setting.
- Be referred to a more specialist service, therapist or speciality community pathway such as ASD pathway or ADHD pathway.

There can be a considerable wait time for an assessment, and then referral to a specialist pathway. You can keep up to date with how long the wait will be by keeping in touch with the Waiting List Co-ordinator by contacting 01302 642302.

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## The latest from The SEND Shadow Board

What is the SEND Shadow Board?

The SEND Shadow Board helps to ensure that young people with SEND have their voices heard on decisions that affect them in Education, Health and Social Care. The SEND Shadow Board meetings are an opportunity to meet the people who manage these services and for children and young people to talk about their lived experiences as a young person with SEND. These meetings then feed into developing and improving services in Doncaster.

The SEND Shadow Board met on 27th February 2024 where discussions took place on creating a video which will be made with the voices of children and young people with SEND. This video will be used as a training aid for teachers, school staff, sencos, and professionals to help them to understand children and young people with SEND, and what works for them in a school setting and what doesn't. Members of the SEND Shadow Board volunteered to take part in this video which is being produced by Doncaster Council. 

The Doncaster EHC Hub is coming to Doncaster. The EHC Hub is created by Idox and is an innovative digital platform supporting engagement, contributions, and collaboration on EHC assessments, plans and reviews. It offers complete transparency for families, professionals and education settings, truly transforming the way local authorities work with their partners. The EHC Hub will enable parents/carers, professionals, schools and senco's to apply for, update, manage and issue EHCP's in Doncaster on a digital platform. All parties will be able to see all aspects of the EHCP and contribute accordingly. Currently Doncaster Council are in the process of setting up the EHC hub. This will be going live over the next few months. Online training for parents/carers representatives, schools and professionals is underway and parents will be informed of when to set up an account as part of the annual review process. Initially the EHC hub will be available for new EHCP requests, and the rollout of the annual reviews of EHCP will follow in stages. We will post any updates on our Facebook page.

# Disability Benefits Increase

From April 2024 The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) has confirmed that disability benefits will increase by 6.7%. The rates will rise in line with the September consumer price index (CPI) inflation figure. Increases can be seen in Disability Living Allowance, PIP and Attendance Allowance. #### **SEMH Hubs at Doncaster Schools**

The City Of Doncaster Council is in the process of developing four specialist Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) Hubs. The Hubs will be attached to three primary schools and one secondary school in Doncaster. When they are fully operational, the Hubs are expected to provide places for up to 10 children each, on a full-time basis. The Hubs will be attached to Brooke Primary Academy, Castle Hills Primary Academy, Conisbrough Ivanhoe Primary Academy and The McAuley Catholic High School. The Hubs are expected to be operational in 2024 and placements are initially likely to be allocated to children who have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).
