Introduction and Welcome

Welcome to the first newsletter of 2024. We are excited for the year ahead, delivering quality workshops, supporting parents and carers and helping the voices of parents and carers be heard. Towards the end of the year we saw our membership grow and in light of this we thought we would provide you all with an overview of how we operate and the services we offer.

We are made up of Doncaster Partnership For Carers, Doncaster Parents Voice and Doncaster Autism Service.



As you can see above, Doncaster Partnership For Carers (DPFC) is the over-arching body, and Doncaster Parents Voice and Doncaster Autism Service operates alongside Doncaster Partnership For Carers. This means that we are able to provide a wide range of services for carers, parent/carers, and autistic children, young people and adults through these 3 services. Below is an overview of each of the services:

Doncaster Partnership For Carers (DPFC)

DPFC is based on Regent Terrace and is the hub for most of the activities across all the services and is known as The Carers Centre. The Centre is run by Doncaster Partnership For Carers, a local charity which was set up in 1991 by family carers for family carers. Since opening our doors in 1992 at the Lansdowne Centre in Intake, DPFC has been instrumental in local changes in service provision and support for carers of all ages and their families.

DPFC has moved premises many times, but since 2012 we have been located in the city centre on Regent Terrace. We are an independent charity who regularly raises funds to enable us to continue our work by applying for grants, running raffles and hiring out rooms at the Carers Centre. As we are a charity we always welcome donations which are very much appreciated. We are run predominately by a team of volunteers who enable the Carers Centre to continue being a place where carers can receive support. DPFC purpose has been to have a presence on local decision making boards in the council and health services, as well as providing emotional and practical support to carers of all ages. Services offered at DPFC include, counselling, telephone befriending service, benefits appointments, coffee mornings, and advice and information. Doncaster Parents Voice (DPV)

Is a platform for parent carers and their families to come together and have their voices heard when local decisions involving education, health and social care are being made. Our aim is to ensure the needs of all children and young people with SEND (aged 0-25) are met. We are run by a steering group made up of volunteers who give up their time to ensure parents voices are heard. We do this by working with other local SEND support groups, attending SEND parents coffee mornings in schools and we also work closely with Doncaster Autism Service on some of the services they offer. We work alongside the Carers Centre who provide us with administration support, and host and facilitate our groups/coffee mornings, and meetings for parents, children and young people so that we can hear their stories, suggestions and ideas to feed into the local decision making arenas. Funding permitting we arrange family activities and days out in the school holidays for all the family including siblings. We also hold social groups and workshops, provide therapies, benefits and counselling appointments, and provide advice and information to families. Check out our Facebook page for more information.

Doncaster Autism Service (DAS)?

DAS is a collaboration between NHS South Yorkshire Integrated Care Board (formerly Doncaster Clinical Commissioning Group), Doncaster Council, Doncaster Parents Voice, Doncaster Partnership For Carers and the ASCETS Team. DAS services have been designed to build on existing services currently offered by DPV and ASCETS but with a specialism in autism. DAS works with DPV and DPFC to support autistic people of all ages and their families. DAS offers a wide range of services such as post diagnostic 1:1 support, workshops, social groups, therapies, counselling, benefits appointments and information and advice. 
